This has been my first year as Treasurer for the hockey club. The experience has been awesome and a real eye-opener.


I'd like to thank our sponsors who supported the club this season, your contribution is greatly appreciated.

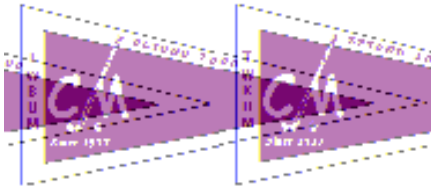
We had a couple of tasty fundraisers this year! The cake stall and chocolate sales raised over \$1500. We also had a raffle and a Dutch auction.
