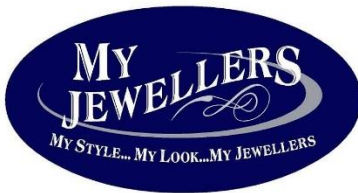

Presidents Report

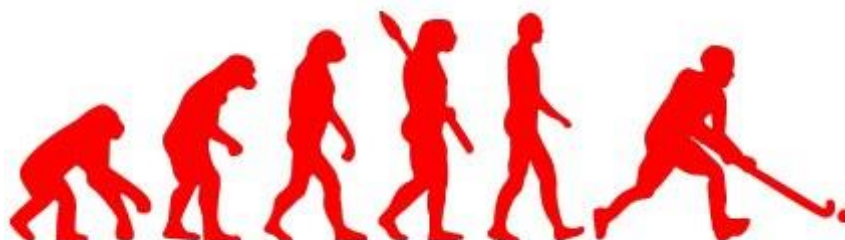
Division 3 Men

New Rule Changes for 2013

There were two main rule changes that were implemented into the game this year. These new rules affected the method of scoring and the procedure for taking a free hit. The first new rule was that a goal can now be scored if either an attacker plays the ball or if the ball touches the stick of a defender, within the circle. This could have been used as a tactic by the attackers and also meant that defenders and goal keepers had to be particularly careful around the goals. The second new rule was that the ball may now be raised immediately from a 'free hit' using either a push or a flick.
