McKenna Park Report

I was honoured to be asked to represent the Club as the McKenna Park nominee earlier this year.

The committee is made up of Trust, Club, Hockey NW and Hockey Tasmania members and organises the day to day running of the complex.

Unfortunately, in the past many members have seen the organisation as a *Them* and *Us* concern. This is not the case currently and I am working hard to address many of the matters that our Club have raised.

The complex is ageing and needs an uplift. You will have noticed some changes recently. They may be cosmetic but, are certainly a start. Dug outs have been repainted and new power points are to be installed. Fencing has been tidied up and new matting laid on the concrete in front of the complex. The matting was laid for safety as when wet it became slippery and dangerous. Interior lighting of the complex has all been replaced with LED lighting and/or replaced as necessary. Hot water cylinders have been replaced and showers upgraded in the ladies change rooms. Over the next few months toilets and shower areas will all be repainted.

We are currently applying for two grants one of \$10k to upgrade the kitchen area and one of \$80k to upgrade the towers and lighting. The committee is conscious of players' safety and believes the complex needs to be utilised more than at present.

Monies are put aside each year to replace the turf as and when it needs doing.

Three items that concern the Club are worth noting. Prior to next season the turf lighting will be recalibrated and balanced. This will mean that the players will have a brighter and clearer playing field. The turf will also be scrubbed as it is becoming dirty and in some places mouldy.

The third thing is the fact that our Club has been given the go ahead to erect a larger shed to store our equipment which will enable us to consolidate everything in the one area.

I am aware there are others issues which you have and I am happy to take them to the committee. Refer them first to President Petrina or to myself.

Once again thank you for having the confidence in me to represent you all.
